Admission Policy 2020/2021

The Governing Body is responsible for the admission of pupils to Bishop John Robinson Church of England School and will admit 30 pupils to the reception class in September 2020. This admission limit has been agreed between the Governing Body and the Local Authority and applies to the year 2020-2021. Although the school operates a one point of entry system for admissions, parents reserve the right to defer their child's admission until they have reached statutory school age. You will need to make your request in writing so that the place can be reserved until the beginning of the term following your child's 5th birthday.

The Governing body is required to abide by the maximum limits for infant classes (5, 6, and 7 year olds), i.e., 30 pupils per class.

(A) Foundation Places

The Governing Body has designated 15 places to be offered to pupils whose families (see footnote 1) are faithful and regular worshippers in a Christian Church which is a full member of 'Churches Together in Britain and Ireland' or the 'Evangelical Alliance'. Written evidence of applicants' commitment to their place of worship (in the form of a Faith Supplementary Form) will be required at the time of application. This can be found on the reverse of the Application Form available from the school. Once signed by either St Paul's Church, William Temple Church, The Church of the Cross or West Thamesmead Community Church it should be returned to the school office. If there are more than 15 applicants, places will be allocated according to the following criteria. These are stated in order of priority:

- 1) First priority will go to children with an education, health and care plan (EHCP) naming the school and Looked after Children in public care. (See footnote 2) Remaining places will be given in the following priority order:-
- 2) Children whose parents/carers are faithful and regular worshippers at St Paul's Congregation, the Congregations of William Temple Church, The Church of the Cross and the Church Plant in West Thamesmead (see footnote 3)
- 3) Children whose parents/carers are faithful and regular worshippers at St Paul's Roman Catholic congregation in Thamesmead or another Christian church (as defined above) which is within the Thamesmead and Abbey Wood estate (ie North of the railway line.)
- 4) Children who will have a brother or sister in the main school at the time of admission. Siblings must live at the same address (see footnote 4).
- 5) The nearness of the home (See footnote 5) to the school.

In the event that two or more applicants have equal right to a place under any of the above criteria, the Governing Body will apply the criteria, in order of priority, to these applicants. Should there be a need for a tie-breaker to be used, this will be decided by names drawn from a hat.

If there are less than 15 qualified applicants for foundation places, any unfilled places will become additional open places. **Unsuccessful applicants for foundation places will be considered for any open places remaining unfilled at the end of the allocation procedure.**

(B) Open Places

The Governing Body has designated 15 places each year as open places, to be offered to pupils who do not qualify for a foundation place, but whose parents have chosen the school for the type of education it provides. PROCEDURE FOR APPLICATIONS

Parents/carers who wish to have their child considered for admission to our school must complete a Common Application Form (CAF) which can be obtained and returned to the applicants home Local Authority. Parents who wish to apply under the Foundation criteria must also complete the school's Supplementary Information Form (SIF) which is available in hard copy or on either the school's or home LA's website. Once signed by either St Paul's Church, William Temple Church, The Church of the Cross or West Thamesmead Community Church it should be returned to the school office. **Failure to return the supplementary information form (SIF) will result in the application being considered under the open places.** The closing date for applications for places in the academic year starting in September 2019 is as advertised in the Local Authority Booklet "Primary Schools in royal Greenwich".

LATE APPLICATIONS

We follow the Local Authority policy for late applications as stated in the booklet "Choosing a Nursery and Primary School in Greenwich."

APPEALS

Parents/carers of children who are not offered a place have the right to appeal to an Independent Appeal Committee under the 1998 School Standards and Framework Act. Parents wishing to appeal should obtain an appeal form from the school. The form should be sent to the Clerk to the Appeal Committee, c/o the school, within 14 days of the notification of the decision.

Should some appeals be unsuccessful, the Governing Body will not consider further applications from those parents/carers within the same academic year unless there have been significant and material changes in their circumstances.

WAITING LIST

The school keeps a waiting list and it is ordered in accordance with our Admission Criteria. This will be kept for the academic year. Where possible, in year vacancies will be filled to maintain the designated balance of each cohort.

The Governing Body is responsible for in-year admissions to this School. Parents/carers wishing to apply in-year must complete an application form and return this to the School.

Procedures for late applications and in year admissions will be in accordance with the Local Authority scheme for the co-ordination of primary school admissions and Fair Access Protocol.

Parents/carers considering sending their child to Bishop John Robinson CE Primary School are welcome to visit us after arranging an appointment with the Head Teacher.

STARTING SCHOOL

Nursery Admissions

Governors have set a limit of 26 places in the Nursery and the over-subscription criteria will be applied in the same way as for the main school.

(B) Foundation Places

The Governing Body has designated 13 places to be offered to pupils whose families (see footnote 1) are faithful and regular worshippers in a Christian Church which is a full member of 'Churches Together in Britain and Ireland' or the 'Evangelical Alliance'. Written evidence of applicants' commitment to their place of worship (in the form of a Faith Supplementary Form) will be required at the time of application. This can be found on the reverse of the Application Form available from the school. 9) Children who will have a brother or sister in the main school at the time of admission. Siblings must live at the same address (see footnote 4).

10) The nearness of the home (See footnote 5) to the school.

Children will be admitted to our Nursery between their 3rd and 4th birthdays. The Admissions Panel meets each year at the start of the Summer Term following which parents will be notified of the decision. All children enter the Nursery on a part time morning basis.

- (a) Criteria for admission to the Nursery class are the same as those for the school. In the event of an odd number of places to fill, the 'odd' place will be allocated on alternate occasions to an 'Open' or a 'Foundation' applicant.

- ✓ Children whose 3rd birthdays fall between 1 April 2017 and 31 August 2017 are admitted at the beginning of the Autumn Term in 2020
- ✓ Children whose 3rd birthdays fall between 1 September 2017 and 31 December 2017 are admitted at the beginning of the Spring Term in 2021
- ✓ Children whose 3rd birthdays fall between 1 January 2018 and 31 March 2018 are admitted at the beginning of the Summer Term in 2021

It must be emphasised that admission to the Nursery in no way guarantees that a place will be available in the school. If you decide that you would like your child to attend Bishop John Robinson CE Primary School, you will need to complete the Common Application Form (available from the Local Authority) and the Faith Supplementary Information Form (SIF) (available from the school office) if you are applying under the Foundation criteria.

Footnotes

- 1) As defined in the Local Authority Booklet "Primary Schools in Royal Greenwich" this should be the person with parental responsibility for the named child. For children who reside with a relative or carer other than a parent, a residence order or other court order is also required
- 2) Children who are looked after and are in the care of local authorities as defined by section 22 of the Children's Act 1989. Children who are under an agreed series of short-term placements (such as respite) are excluded.
- 3) If an application under a church criteria is to be considered the Faith Supplementary form must be completed by The Rector, Priest, Pastor, Minister or the Team Vicar of St Paul's Church, William Temple Church, The Church of the Cross or West Thamesmead Community Church in conjunction with the parents and returned to the school by the date identified in the Local Authority Booklet "Primary Schools in Royal Greenwich" in the year prior to admission. The form is available from the school.
- 4) 'Faithful and regular parents/carers' would be members of the above congregations, and who have attended regularly on at least a fortnightly basis for a period of nine months. Parents/carers who recently moved into Thamesmead will need a letter from the incumbent of the church from which they came detailing a similar level of commitment.
- 5) Children with a sibling living at the same address attending the school at the time of the child's admission. Sibling means a full/half/step brother or sister. This does not include siblings attending the school's nursery provision.
- 6) Distance from home to school is measured by the Local Authority, as a straight line from the centre of the home address to the centre of the school.
