NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF THE URBAN DESIGN GUIDE SUPPLEMENTARY PLANNING DOCUMENT (SPD)

In accordance with Regulation 11 and Regulation 14 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012, notice is hereby given that THE ROYAL BOROUGH OF GREENWICH ("the Council") adopted the Urban Design Guide Supplementary Planning Document (SPD) on 18 October 2023 and produced an Adoption Statement to this effect.

The SPD will support and provide more detailed guidance on the design policies in the Royal Greenwich Local Plan. The document is subdivided into nine sections, which cover a wide range of design related topics, from the scale of the whole borough to that of single residential units.

The SPD includes high-level guidance on the intensification of identified type-areas in the Royal Borough, design principles for forming a robust development strategy and site layout, designing accessible, inclusive and safe streets and public spaces, best practice and contextual building design and residential amenity.

Chapters H and I of the SPD supersede the existing Design Guidance for Shopfronts SPD and Residential Extensions, Basements and Conversions Guidance SPD, including on guidance regarding Houses in Multiple Occupation (HMO). These have now been withdrawn, in accordance with Regulation 15 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012.

The SPD is consistent with Royal Greenwich Core Strategy (2014) and in conformity with the London Plan (2021). The SPD is part of the Royal Borough of Greenwich's planning policy framework and will be a material consideration in the determination of planning applications.
