

Team Around the Child Meetings (TAC's)



What is a Team Around the Child meeting?

- It's a meeting where a child and their family's needs are at the centre of the discussion.
- A group of people who are supporting the child, will work together in an open and honest way to create a plan of support.



- TAC meetings usually take place every 6 months.
- We will discuss updated information about your child's skills and their support needs will be discussed.
- Personal Learning Plan outcomes and targets may be discussed and agreed together
- Parents always attend TAC meetings and are part of the future planning.



- TAC meetings often take place in your child's nursery or childminders.
- TAC meetings are a positive approach to thinking about your child's learning needs and what can be put in place to support them.
- Everyone who attends will receive a record of the meeting.



- TAC meetings can be opportunities to build positive relationships with you and the services supporting you.
- You will have an opportunity during the meeting to ask for further support or advice
