NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF THE CLIMATE RESILIENCE SUPPLEMENTARY PLANNING DOCUMENT (SPD)

In accordance with Regulation 11 and Regulation 14 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012, notice is hereby given that THE ROYAL BOROUGH OF GREENWICH (“the Council”) adopted the Climate Resilience Supplementary Planning Document (SPD) on 25th March 2026 and produced an Adoption Statement to this effect. The Greener Greenwich SPD is superseded and has now been revoked by the Council.

The SPD sets out key principles and development interventions for climate resilience and sustainability recommended by the Council. It ensures that any future development is planned in a sustainable way that focuses on climate resilience. The SPD aims to futureproof for a greener Royal Greenwich through transformative adaptations and decrease carbon emissions in developments. The advice in the SPD covers urban greening, retrofitting and refurbishing, energy efficiency, and extensions among other relevant aspects of climate change. This information and advice guides developers and applicants when making planning applications while also helping wider stakeholders understand the value of planting and efficient energy use for climate resilience and our wellbeing.

The SPD is consistent with Royal Greenwich Core Strategy (2014) and in conformity with the London Plan (2021). The SPD is part of the Royal Borough of Greenwich’s planning policy framework and will be a material consideration in the determination of planning applications. Any person aggrieved by the Climate Resilience SPD may apply to the High Court for permission to apply for judicial review of the decision to adopt the SPD, and any such application for leave must be made promptly and in any event not later than 3 months after the date of adoption specified above. Any such application must be made by 25th June 2026.
